## **MAINPRO-C SEMINAR**

**Presentation Tile:** Supportive Psychotherapy: Ten Things to Do, and Ten Things to Avoid (Based on journal articles by Dr. Michael Paré)

**Program Description:** Most physicians (even Psychatrists) do not do provide very "specialized" Psychotherapy (CBT, or Psychodynamic, Interpersonal etc.) but rather they do supportive psychotherapy. Thus this program in very practical since it will be covering what most of us <u>really</u> do. Inaddition it is also a very interactive learning session. The session will be a general outline of several of the key positive elements of psychotherapy (such as empathy and support) and several things to avoid (such as excessive reassurance and excessive advice giving).
